

RIVERCOM USER GROUP MEETING

Tuesday, May 13, 2008

Present: Phil Mosher, CCFD#1; Jim Brown, WPD; Dave Baker, DCFD#2; Wayne Walker, Lifeline; Tom Martin, CCFD#8; Millie Tirapelle, Jerry Corder, RiverCom.

Phil Mosher called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

Introductions: Made by all present.

RiverCom Director Report:

- Director Tirapelle update on regionalization on telephone systems. Stating that the State has set aside 1.3 million dollars for a pilot program for a centralized telephone system. She advised that a meeting has been scheduled for May 20, 2008 in Moses Lake for the East side counties. There are several counties that would like to be the pilot site, as they will receive new phone equipment. Director Tirapelle advised that to accurately test the regionalization program, it should be tested on a center that receives numerous calls. However, the larger counties that would like to be the pilot centers do not have contracts with the State 911 Office and if selected they would receive new phone equipment that would be paid for by the State 911 Office. Director Tirapelle advised that Thurston County is considering being the pilot center from the East, along with Benton and Spokane Counties. Director Tirapelle advised that a Quest representative indicated that the monthly cost associated with this program would be \$1 million dollars.
- MyStateUSA: Jerry Corder advised that he is waiting for Wenatchee Fire to send their user list, as he had volunteered to do a one time set up. Jim Brown questioned if there is a way to limit access when utilizing the MyStateUSA system due to the amount of personal information in the system? Jerry stated that he will check on this; Director Tirapelle requested that Jerry and Jim work on this today if possible.
- Site Update:
 - Carmichael; air conditioning unit to be installed this week.
 - Blag; new tower installation on schedule.
 - Keystone; Director Tirapelle advised that a meeting has been established with the DNR, Chelan County PUD and RiverCom regarding a replacement building. Currently, the DNR would like RiverCom to use the existing footprint of the building and RiverCom would like a larger building and a new tower. Jerry Corder advised that RiverCom will offer to do cleanup and some replanting from the fire also, work on building a road. Currently this is a solar site and the Chelan PUD is committed to bringing power to the top of Keystone.
- Director Tirapelle advised that Misty Viebrock has been working on building out the medical response plans for Wenatchee Fire Dept.
- Director Tirapelle advised that Trisha Stender has been promoted to shift supervisor also, Monica Miller returned from Okalahoma, also as a supervisor.
- Jerry Corder advised that interviews were held for the Communications Technician position and the job has been offered to Ron Kuch.

Committee Reports:

- Jerry Corder advised that May 20th is scheduled for Spillman patch. Phil Mosher questioned if there is a fire representative at the Spillman Administrators Meetings? Jerry advised that Brett is representing fire.
- Discussion was held regarding new Sonic Wall router at RiverCom and we will be moving East Wenatchee Police Department and other agencies over. Wayne Walker from Lifeline had questions on how to connect and if he needed a FIPS 140-2 router? Jerry advised that he will contact Heather Anderson from ACCESS regarding connecting Lifeline without being encrypted. Wayne advised that Lifeline would like to have access to the map, Phil Mosher advised that he could get Lifeline the mapping portion and Lifeline would have to manually type in the address, that it would not be a pinpoint map.
- Director Tirapelle advised that the GIS meeting last week went very well.

Good Of The Order:

- Director Tirapelle advised that she will be asking the RiverCom Administrative Board for action tomorrow on the Norcom bill that was received by RiverCom. This is for the Goat Mountain site and a bill was sent to RiverCom and also Chelan County Sheriff's Office. Director Tirapelle stated that Chelan County Sheriff's Office and RiverCom does not have any supporting documentation or verbal agreements regarding this site.
